PRESIDENT'S AWARD

Objective

The SOGC would like to recognize an outstanding physician in Canada for a contribution which best reflects the objectives of the Society. The individual must be in practice for a number of years and have demonstrated leadership qualities at the national and/or international level.

Description

The President's Award is the highest recognition awarded to a member for outstanding contributions and commitment to women's health and ongoing support to the specialty and the SOGC.

Award

This prestigious award is presented during the Annual Clinical Meeting's Awards Ceremony and publicized nationally. The recipient's name appears on a plaque at the SOGC's National Office. The recipient will also receive a \$1,000 prize.

The President puts forward a nomination that is discussed and approved by SOGC Executive and Council during its winter meeting.

Eligibility

- Member obstetrician/gynaecologist of the SOGC in good standing;
- Present or past committee or Council member;
- Made significant contributions over a consistent period of time to SOGC projects and programs nationally and/or internationally;
- Actively advocates on behalf of SOGC and for women's health;
- Recognized as a leader in their field of either obstetrics, gynaecology or a subspecialty.

Communication Plan

The recipient of this award shall submit a one page biography, an electronic picture as well as a copy of his or her acceptance speech. In addition to being widely distributed across Canada to medical journals such as the Medical Post and L'Actualité Médicale, these will be sent to all major national newspapers as a press release. Particular care will also be directed to highlight this award in the regional newspapers of the province of the Award Recipient.

Benefits to the Award Recipient

The Award Recipient will receive complimentary registration to any regional meetings (excluding the ICME) during a one year period from June to May.

Secondly, the Award Recipient will be offered to present at three of the Regional Meetings in the coming year (excluding the ICME meeting). He or she will give a talk of his/her choice on an issue of women's health. This lecture will be designated "The Presidential Award Lecture". He or she will receive a travel and hotel accommodation subsidy reimbursement to present at these three regional meetings of his/her choice. At the ACM, where the recipient is given the award, the registration fee will be waived, and two hotel nights and economy travel will be paid.

Application Deadline

The President may submit one nomination by February 15 of each year.

Nomination and Selection

Nomination is by the current SOGC President and is approved at the annual winter Executive and Council meetings.

HONORARY MEMBER AWARD

Description

Award of merit to an individual whose outstanding achievements reflect the aims and objectives of the SOGC.

Award

A plaque is awarded at the June Council Dinner. Honorary members are exempted from membership fees and are entitled to all privileges and benefits of an SOGC member.

Eligibility

- Made significant contributions to women's health nationally and/or internationally;
- Supports the aims and objectives of the SOGC as well as its projects and programs;
- Not a current member of the SOGC.



Communication Plan

The recipient of this award shall submit a one page biography and an electronic picture. The Award recipient will be recognized by way of a press release and through the SOGC News.

Benefits to the Award Recipient

The Award Recipient will receive complimentary registration to the Annual Clinical Meeting where he or she receives the Award.

Application Deadline

The SOGC Executive and Council members may submit nominations by February 15 of each year.

Nomination and Selection

Honorary members are nominated by the SOGC Executive and Council and approved at their annual winter meetings.

Advantages of the Award Recipient

The Award Recipients will receive free registration to the Annual Clinical Meeting where they are recognized. He or she will receive \$500 to help offset the expenses associated with the acceptance of this award.

Application Deadline

Each Regional Committee may submit one nomination by February 15 of each year.

CANADIAN FOUNDATION FOR WOMEN'S HEALTH ANNUAL RESEARCH GRANTS

Description

The Canadian Foundation for Women's Health is dedicated to raising funds for research in women's health and as such, the goal of the Foundation is to ensure that women's interests and concerns are represented in medical research and in the search of scientific knowledge. An annual grants competition fulfils this mandate.

Award

The amount of funding varies from year to year. The Foundation's Website indicates information on selection guidelines and available grants. A plaque is presented at the SOGC's Annual Clinical Meeting.



Eligibility

- Must be affiliated with a Canadian university or health care institution able to provide ethics review in compliance with Canadian standards.
- Research projects directly related to women's health will be considered.

Application Deadline

The deadline is the first week of February. Visit the Canadian Foundation for Women's Health Website for updated deadlines.

Selection

Applications are reviewed by peer reviewers identified by the Grants Committee of the Canadian Foundation for Women's Health. Awarding of the grant is based on the highest score received.

CANADIAN FOUNDATION FOR WOMEN'S HEALTH ANNUAL RESIDENT RESEARCHER AWARD

Description

The Canadian Foundation for Women's Health recognizes the importance of encouraging up and coming researchers by offering the Annual Resident Researcher Award. This award is presented for the best research project in women's health.

Award

The amount of each grant is \$500. The annual award is available for one resident researcher from each of the 16 university teaching hospitals.

Eligibility

The award is for resident researchers performing research in all aspects of women's health.

Application Deadline

Contact the university's department chair for the application deadline.

Selection

Recipients are chosen by their department. Once identified, the university department chair must submit that person's name before June 30 of that academic year.

SOGC/CNGOF JUNIOR MEMBER AWARD

Description

This award is given to a Junior Member of the SOGC who participates in the Abstract Program during the Annual Clinical Meeting (ACM). The winner participates in an exchange program between the SOGC and the Collège national des gynécologues et obstétriciens français (CNGOF) by attending the Collège's annual clinical meeting. This reciprocal award also allows a French resident to attend the SOGC's ACM.

Award

The SOGC/CNGOF Junior Member Award consists of a subsidized trip to attend the Collège national des gynécologues et obstétriciens français annual clinical meeting in France. The SOGC covers economy air travel, a maximum amount of \$200 towards taxi fares and a meal per diem for 6 days. The CNGOF covers hotel expenses and registration fees.

A first runner up and a second runner up will also be chosen in case the winner is unable to attend the CNGOF annual clinical meeting.

Eligibility

- SOGC Junior Member in good standing.
- Participation in the Abstract Program, paper or poster abstract presentations at the Annual Clinical Meeting.

Candidates Must Demonstrate

- Clear and well organized presentation;
- Thorough knowledge of their subject matter;
- Ability to answer questions;
- Good use of communication tools (visual aids, etc.);
- Delivery of content in a timely fashion.

Application Deadline

As established for Abstract submission dates.

Selection

The winner will be chosen during the Abstract Program judging process and announced at the Annual Clinical Meeting's Awards Ceremony.

ABSTRACT AWARDS

Description

The Abstract Awards is for the best oral and poster presentations at the SOGC's Annual Clinical Meeting (ACM).

Award

Recipients will receive a certificate and a monetary award. The amount allocated ranges from \$750 to \$1,500 depending on the category. Categories include posters and papers in obstetrics, gynaecology, Junior Member obstetrics and Junior Member gynaecology, Stump the Professor and international women's health.

Eligibility

- Member in good standing of the SOGC, Association des obstétriciens et gynécologues du Québec; (AOGQ), Society of Gynecologic Oncologists of Canada (GOC), Society of Canadian Colposcopists; (SCC), Canadian Society of Urogynaecology and Reconstructive Pelvic surgery (CSURPS) or the Society of Gynaecologic Endoscopy of Canada (SGEC);
- Registered to the Annual Clinical Meeting (with registration fees paid);
- Comply with submission guidelines.

Application Deadline

As per ACM paper, poster and abstract deadlines.

Selection

Judging and selection is made on-site by the ACM Scientific Planning Committee on Abstracts.

MILLENNIUM FELLOWSHIPS FOR COMMUNITY PHYSICIANS

Description

The purpose of this fellowship is to support community based physicians who would like to receive a traineeship enabling them to meet their specific learning needs and those of their community. The clinical professional development may involve, but is not restricted to, the acquisition of technical knowledge or skills; interests in the areas of obstetrics/gynaecology and/or sexual and reproductive health. The traineeship consists of an active, individualized, and practical experience related to clearly defined educational objectives.

Funding is provided by the Foundation for the Promotion of Sexual and Reproductive Health (FPSRH) whose mission is to promote and support educational initiatives in the field of sexual and reproductive health.

Award

The fellowship to the physician is \$7,500 (4 weeks) to a maximum of \$15,000 (8 weeks) or prorated. In addition, \$1,000 will be awarded to the host institution providing the traineeship to assist in covering office expenses. Grant recipients will be recognized at the Annual Clinical Meeting's Awards Ceremony.

Eligibility

- Candidates must be obstetrician/gynaecologist or associate M.D. member of SOGC in good standing at the time of application;
- Preference given to members who have practiced for a minimum of 5 years;
- Applicants must indicate if they are receiving additional subsidies or grants for the intended traineeship;
- The learning activity is to take the form of a short period (up to 8 weeks) of clinical update.

Note: Does not apply to geographic full-time faculty (GFT).

Application Deadline

Winter: February 15 / Autumn: November 15

Selection

The selection committee is composed of the five Regional Committee chairs. Submissions are evaluated on the overall merit of the traineeship and the benefits to the physician and their community.

MILLENNIUM FELLOWSHIPS FOR UNIVERSITY/HOSPITAL BASED PHYSICIANS

Description

The purpose of this fellowship is to support physicians, who are currently full time faculty, who wish to improve their research or increase their clinical surgical expertise by visiting a centre of recognized excellence in their area of interest. The professional development is to be provided at a centre of excellence, providing the specialist with an active, individualized and practical experience related to clearly defined objectives.

Funding is provided by the Foundation for the Promotion of Sexual and Reproductive Health (FPSRH) whose mission is to promote and support educational initiatives in the field of sexual and reproductive health.

Award

Recipients will be awarded \$4,000 for their fellowship. In addition, \$1,000 will be awarded to the host institution providing the traineeship to assist in covering office expenses. Grant recipients will be recognized at the Annual Clinical Meeting's Awards Ceremony.

Eligibility

- Applicants must be an obstetrician/gynaecologist SOGC member in good standing at the time of application and full time faculty at a Canadian university or hospital;
- Preference will be given to members who have practiced for more than five years;

- Applicants must indicate if they are receiving additional subsidies or grants for the intended traineeship;
- The learning activity is to take the form of a short period (4 to 8 weeks) of clinical update.

Application Deadline

February 15

Selection

The selection committee will be comprised of SOGC and APOG representatives. Submissions are evaluated on the overall merit of the traineeship and the benefits to the physician and their community.

MILLENNIUM FELLOWSHIPS FOR NURSES AND MIDWIVES

Description

The purpose of this fellowship is to provide financial support to nurse or midwife SOGC members to enable them to meet specific learning needs and those of their community. This clinical professional development opportunity may involve, but is not restricted to, the acquisition of technical knowledge or skills in the area of obstetrics/gynaecology and/or sexual and reproductive health.

Funding is provided by the Foundation for the Promotion of Sexual and Reproductive Health (FPSRH) whose mission is to promote and support educational initiatives in the field of sexual and reproductive health.

Award

Recipients will be awarded \$3,000 for their fellowship. In addition, \$1,000 will be awarded to the host institution providing the traineeship to assist in covering office expenses. Grant recipients will be recognized at the Annual Clinical Meeting's Awards Ceremony.

Eligibility

- Applicant must be a nurse or midwife SOGC member in good standing at the time of application;
- Applicants must indicate if they are receiving additional subsidies or grants for the intended traineeship;
- The learning activity is to take the form of a short period (up to 8 weeks) of clinical update.

Application Deadline

February 15

Selection

The selection committee is composed of members of the Nurse and Midwife Advisory Committees. Submissions are evaluated on the overall merit of the traineeship and the benefits to the applicant and their community.

SOGC INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT AWARD FOR VOLUNTEERS

Description

The purpose of this award is to assist SOGC obstetrician/gynaecologist members who wish to pursue volunteer obstetric and/or gynaecology clinical work in developing countries.

The volunteer work is to consist of an active and practical experience related to clearly defined medical and/or health related community objectives in a developing country. The grant is offered to physicians who volunteer their time in a clinical or community health setting in developing countries. Additional support in form of grants or small honorariums and token per diems offered to cover expenses such as room and board and local transportation are allowable with this grant.





Award

The recipient will be provided \$3,750 for a six-month term to a maximum of \$15,000 for two-year continuous terms (prorated depending on the length of the assignment). The award is provided to assist with travel and accommodation expenses during the stay outside Canada. Grant recipients will be recognized at the Annual Clinical Meeting's Awards Ceremony.

Eligibility

- Obstetrician/gynaecologist member of SOGC in good standing at the time of application;
- Qualified obstetrician/gynaecologist in Canada;
- Work on a volunteer basis in a developing country hospital, institution or non-governmental organization;
- The activity may be undertaken continuously or in blocks of six months for a maximum of a 24-month consecutive period;
- Applicants must indicate if they are receiving additional subsidies or grants for the intended project.

Note: The grant is not intended for continued professional development learning activities, nor is it to be used to supplement an exchange program within which the physician receives a Canadian salary. Students and residents are not eligible.

Winter: February 15 / Autumn: November 15

Selection

Submissions are evaluated by the International Women's Health Committee on the overall merit of the traineeship and the benefits to the physician and the host community.

JUNIOR MEMBER ELECTIVE GRANT IN INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S HEALTH

Description

The purpose of this fellowship is to assist residents wishing to pursue elective training in international women's health. The general objectives are to allow interested residents to develop a better understanding of women's health issues and the practice of obstetrics and gynaecology in a developing country, and the appreciation for the work conducted by fellow health professionals in those countries. The elective should provide the recipient of the Fellowship with an active, individualized and practical experience in a developing country related to clearly defined education objectives.

Funding is provided by the Foundation for the Promotion of Sexual and Reproductive Health whose mission is to promote and support educational initiatives in the field of sexual and reproductive health.

Award

The recipient will be awarded \$4,000 and the host medical institution in the developing country will receive \$1,000 Canadian. Grant recipients will be recognized at the Annual Clinical Meeting's Awards Ceremony.

Eligibility

- Applicant must be a Junior Member of the SOGC in good standing at time of application;
- Applicant must be enrolled in a residency training program in Canada;
- Applicant must indicate whether they have applied for more than one grant;
- The traineeship must be spent in a clinical setting in a developing country within one year of the Fellowship adjudication;
- The learning activity is to take the form of a short period (2 to 4 months) of clinical update.

Application Deadline

Winter: February 15 / Autumn: November 15

Selection

Submissions are evaluated on the overall merit of the traineeship and the benefits to the physician and their community.

JUNIOR MEMBER ELECTIVE FELLOWSHIP GRANTS

Description

The Junior Member Elective Fellowship Grants are intended to assist Junior Members in pursuing elective training in obstetrics and gynaecology during their residency program.

Award

A varying number of grants ranging from \$2,500 to \$3,000 are awarded to the top fellowship proposals to assist in covering expenses incurred while participating in an elective program. Grant recipients will be recognized at the Annual Clinical Meeting's Awards Ceremony.

The distribution of awards is contingent upon the availability of funding in unrestricted educational grants.

Eligibility

- Applicant must be a Junior Member of the SOGC in good standing at time of application;
- Applicant must be enrolled in a residency training program in Canada;
- Elective training must be held in Canada, unless the chosen program is not available in Canada;
- Training must be four weeks minimum;
- Applicant must indicate whether they have applied for more than one grant;
- Only one fellowship per elective may be granted.

The fellowship must start within six months of the award and must be completed within 12 months after the start of the fellowship. A final report (with summary of expenses) is required within three months of the completion of the program to receive the final portion of the grant.

Winter: February 15 / Autumn: November 15

Selection

The Selection Committee is composed of representatives from the SOGC, the Junior Member Committee and the Promotion of the Specialty Committee. Submissions are evaluated on the overall merit of the traineeship.

SOGC/CFWH JOURNALISM AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN WOMEN'S HEALTH REPORTING

Description

The SOGC/CFWH Journalism Award for Excellence in Women's Reproductive Health Reporting recognizes outstanding reporting on women's reproductive health issues appearing in consumer newspapers, magazines and broadcasts across Canada. This award has been designed by the SOGC and the Canadian Foundation for Women's Health (CFWH) to highlight journalism's valuable service, enabling women to make informed health and lifestyle choices with accurate, responsible and insightful communication.

Award

A cash prize of \$1,000 and a plaque will be presented to the winners of both media categories (print and broadcast) at the Annual Clinical Meeting's Awards Ceremony.

Eligibility

The award recognizes reports focusing on women's health issues in a Canadian consumer newspaper, magazine, or broadcast report in Canada from January 1 - December 31 of the previous year. Trade pieces are not accepted.



Categories:

- **Broadcast:** Television or radio (broadcast submissions should be documentary style and at least 5 minutes in duration)
- **Print:** Newspaper, general interest magazine or on-line news (and print articles should be feature style, at least 1,500 words in length)

All articles and reports will be judged by a panel of women's health experts, including gynaecologists, obstetricians, midwives, family physicians, nurses and journalists.

G. **DISCLOSURE:** Applicants receiving additional subsidies or grants for the intended project are to identify these in the application.

H. **WAITING PERIOD:** Previous awardees can re-apply for the same award after a three year waiting period. Unsuccessful applicants are encouraged to update their application and re-submit it for consideration in the following iteration.
