Why did you choose this fellowship? Minimally Invasive Gynecologic Surgery (MIGS) encapsulates a set of medical and surgical services dedicated to helping people with complex benign gynecologic issues like endometriosis, chronic pelvic pain, uterine fibroids, uterine isthmoceles, high BMI surgery, invasive placentas and more. There is a need for training beyond residency to gain the knowledge and technical skills to provide many of these services.

What are the strengths of/why did you choose your specific fellowship program? Nested in the ‘cultural cradle of Canada,’ we are the referral site for complex gynecologic surgery for all of Manitoba and parts of Northwestern Ontario, Saskatchewan, and Nunavut. We have a high volume of complex cases – deep endometriosis, fibroids, c-section ectopics/isthmoceles, placenta accreta spectrum cases and more. Our license plates don’t lie; it truly is ‘Friendly Manitoba,’ and our 5 fellowship-trained MIGS experts are excited to help build your skill set and confidence in MIGS.
