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Why did you choose this fellowship? I chose gynecologic oncology because it combines complex surgery, longitudinal patient relationships, and meaningful multidisciplinary care. The field allows you to be deeply involved in a patient's journey, from diagnosis through treatment and survivorship.

What are the strengths of/why did you choose your specific fellowship program? McGill offers excellent surgical mentorship, exposure to complex oncologic cases, and outstanding opportunities in research. The culture is collaborative, fellows are trusted early, and there is strong support for academic

career development.

What advice would you give to residents interested in your fellowship program? Come with curiosity, humility, and a strong work ethic. Show genuine interest in gynecologic oncology early, get involved in research if possible, and don't underestimate the value of being a good team player, this program values professionalism and collegiality.

What do you hope future practice will look like? I hope to combine high-quality, patient-centered surgical oncology and medical oncology with active clinical research, mentorship of trainees, and contributions to improving gynecologic cancer care at both the institutional and system level.
